This model and methodology is an integration of best practice strategies borrowed from general psychology, learning, clinical and behavioral psychology, neuropsychology, biopsychosocial theory and interventions, social psychology, industrial / organizational and human resources psychology and stress management and coping studies and literature. It is employed in direct supervision and general staff training and inservices and also adapted for general staff training in client stress management and behavioral management, co worker stress management and conflict resolution and more general life stress management.

(2) Research, review, presentation, writing and publication activity covered a broad range of rehabilitation related areas reflective of a varied clinical practice. Topics ranged from assessment (including response bias) to treatment for various aspects of rehabilitation, neurobehavioral rehabilitation, chronic pain assessment and management, adaptation to neurological injury and impairment, disability assessment, adaptation to disability, neuropsychological assessment and neuroethics and forensic neuropsychology.
